Estate Settlement

- Is it believed the estate settlement will be non-contentious (i.e., no litigation)?
- Are they comfortable with virtual meetings and navigating technology (i.e., email, electronic signatures, etc.)?

*What is Probate?

Probate is the legal process whereby the Last Will and Testament (if there is one) and the person legally responsible for settling the estate (the executor/estate representative) is legally verified. It is typically needed when third parties such as banks, require proof before accepting instructions.

Most common situations where probate is likely required:

- There is no will and there are assets in the deceased's sole name;
- There are financial accounts held solely in the deceased's name with no named beneficiaries;
- There are real estate assets owned solely in the deceased's name or as tenants in common (i.e., not joint with right of survivorship).
